PSC Recommendation

Kenya's Achievement

3. Urges the IGAD Member States to mainstream the CPPs within their long term plans (visions) and Medium Term Plans.

5. The IGAD Secretariat and Member States to further strengthen regional, national, sub-national and cross border resilience coordination mechanisms.

- These had already been achieved by Kenya before the last PSC.
- Kenya has mainstreamed its CPP into the MTP III (2018-2022).
- The EDE Medium Term Plan III has also been mainstreamed into the County Integrated Development Plans for the period 2018-2022.
- Kenya continued strengthening its coordination mechanisms through provision of dedicated funds for coordination (EDE: DRMC) and technical support through the NDMA – as secretariat and convener of coordination structures.
 - Kenya is in the process of commissioning a mid-term review (MTR) for the EDE to assess effectiveness, efficiency and sustainability of the coordination structures.



The IGAD Secretariat and Member States to promote research, dissemination and adoption of innovations/ technologies that are relevant for the implementation of IDDRSI and scale out resilience innovations.	 Seven PhD students have, with effect from June 2020 been provided with research funds through the NDMA. The students will focus on EDE issues that are of priority to Kenya and relevant to ASALs. Besides using remote sensing and the vegetation condition index (VCI) for early warning, Kenya is exploring use of pictorial evaluation tool (PET) in the assessment of forage and livestock body condition as part of drought early warning.

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Regional resilience Projects: Regional Pastoral Livelihoods Resilience Project (RPRLP)




Percent completion of selected results under the RPRLP as at 30 June 2020

Aim: reduce vulnerability to drought related shocks

- Worth US\$ 90.4 million. Funded by World Bank and GoK.
- Started in 2014 and was to end in 2019 and covers 14 counties.
- As at 30th June 2020, 79% of the budget had been disbursed, up from 68.2% during last PSC.
- Overall implementation status was 83%.
- Delivery of specific results is summarized in the graph.

Results completion rate in the DRSLP as 30 June 2020

Result area

Aim: enhance drought resilience and improve sustainable livelihoods

- Worth US\$ 57.03 million and funded by AfDB & GoK.
- Started in July 2013 and was to end in June 2018 but extended by 2 years. It covers 6 counties.
- As at 30th June 2020, 58.7% of the budget had been disbursed compared to 43% during last PSC.
- Results delivery are summarized in the graph

- Delay in procurement processes for some projects.
- COVID-19 slowed project implementation in the last two quarters of 2020.

- Strong M & E mechanisms is paramount in providing evidence to support decisions.
- Stakeholder inclusivity is important to leverage resources.
- Local Peace Committees (LPCs) are valuable interface between the government and communities when responding to conflict and insecurity situations.

Recommendations

1) IGAD Secretariat should support coordination structures – both at regional and national level. This includes supporting member states to mobilize resources for drought resilience.

2) Strengthen monitoring and evaluation to ensure continuous and effective tracking of progress at all levels.

3) Strengthen resource mobilization strategies with special focus on support to resilience building.


